Sixteen patients meeting these criteria were treated with ligament prolotherapy of the SIJ ligaments. Improvement in knee pain was noted in 15 of 16 patients. In the 8 cases with significant loss of range of motion and effusion, objective improvement occurred in 7. Further ideas on additional evaluations are outlined.
